CBSE WEBINAR FOR CLASS X TWO-BOARD EXAMINATION POLICY (2025–26)



CBSE held a National Webinar on 20 November 2025 to explain the new two-board-exam system for Class X. All teachers teaching Class X attended the session. The board clarified that the first exam (Feb–March) will be compulsory, while the second exam (May) will be optional for students wishing to improve their scores, with the best performance reflected in the final mark-sheet. Students may improve in up to three subjects, but those who miss three or more subjects in the first exam will be marked as Essential Repeat and cannot appear for the second attempt. Practical exams and Internal Assessments will be conducted once during the first cycle only. Schools were guided to ensure proper registration, accurate attendance, timely internal-assessment uploads and orientation sessions for parents and students. The webinar emphasized that the new system aims to reduce pressure and provide greater flexibility within the same academic year.

LOGIQUIDS

Logical Reasoning Competition for Classes III to V was held on 20 November 2025 to enhance students' critical thinking and problem-solving skills. Students enthusiastically participated, solving various logical and analytical problems designed to boost their cognitive abilities. The competition fostered love for logical reasoning and helped build strong foundational skills essential for academic success.



MEASURING MINDS, NOT MARKS – SAFAL IN ACTION

Army Public School, Meerut Cantt implemented CBSE's Structured Assessment for Analyzing Learning Key Stage Assessment (SAFAL-KSA), a diagnostic initiative aimed at strengthening competency-based education. Designed to assess core competencies through understanding and application rather than rote learning, SAFAL provides developmental feedback to support improvement in teaching-learning practices. The assessment covered English, Mathematics and Science/EVS for Grades VI and IX and was conducted as per the CBSE schedule in multiple batches from 10 November 2025-2 December 2025. A total of 481 students of Grade IX and 464 students of Grade VI participated. As a non-competitive and non-certification assessment, SAFAL serves as a reflective tool to analyze learning levels and enhance academic outcomes at the school level.




REVAYU RISES: YOUNG INNOVATORS POWERING A SCIENTIFIC FUTURE
